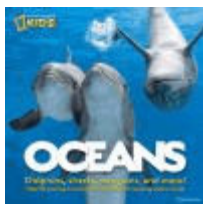

Presents the biggest, smallest, fastest, longest, and other record setters for 2010 in such categories as space, human achievements, sports, entertainment, science, technology, and engineering. **RL Young Adult**

**2. 551.46 RIZ: Rizzo, Johnna. Oceans: dolphins, sharks, penguins, and more!** National Geographic's, c2010. Photographs and fun facts explore the lives and homes of a



variety of sea creatures, including sharks, dolphins, sea turtles, penguins, and many others. **RL 6.7**

**3. 591.986 RYA: Ryan-Henderson, Lisa L. Wild Amazon** Scholastic, c2009. Simple text and full-color photographs provide an introduction to the animals found in the Amazon, such as monkeys and dolphins. **RL 5.4**

**4. 629.44 BAK: Baker, David. International Space Station.** Weigl Publishers, c2010. Offers students an introduction to the International Space Station, describing how it was built, the various components that make up the spacecraft, and its many uses. **RL 6.2**



**5. 636.088 GRE: Greve, Meg. Pet Tricks,** Rourke Pub 2009. Young readers will discover tricks their pets do from nature or tricks taught to them. **RL K-3**

**6. 636.8 Han: Hanson, Anders. Awesome Abyssinians.** ABSO Pub, c2010. Presents a discussion of Abyssinian house cats, covering their behaviors and physical characteristics, with information about pet care and the history of the breed. **RL 2.9**

**7. 636.8 STO: Stone, Lynn M. Persian Cats.** Rourke Pub, 2010. Provides an introduction to the history, physical characteristics, habits, and breeding of Persian cats. **RL 4.3**

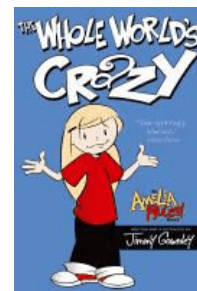
**8. 636.935 JOH: Johnson, Jinny. Hamsters and Gerbils.** Black Rabbit Books, 2009. Describes the behavior of hamsters and gerbils and how to choose and care for hamsters and gerbils as pets"--Provided by publisher. **RL 4.8**

**9. 741.5 STE: Stevens, Eric. Skateboard Sonar.** Stone Arch Books, c2010. Although blind, Matty is an excellent skateboarder, but when the former champion mocks him during the skating competition, Matty shows that seeing is not everything. **RL 2.5**



**10. 741.5 DIS: Disney. Disney Fairies #2, Tinker Bell and the wings of Rani.** Papercutz, 2010. Contains five stories that detail adventures with Tinker Bell and her fairy friends, including the featured story which relates how Rani lost her wings to save Never Land. **RL 3.6**

**11. 741.5 GRO: Grownley, Jimmy. Amelia Rules! The whole word's crazy.** Atheneum Collects the adventures of Amelia Louise McBride, a nine-year-old who recently moved from New York to a small town after her parents were divorced and relies on her friends and family to deal with everyday situations. **RL 3.4**

**stonekeepers curse.** Graphix, c2009. Emily and her brother, Navin, head for Kanalis in order to find the antidote for the poison that has sickened their mother. **RL 3.3**

**13. 741.5 PAR: Parker, Jake, Missile Mouse: Rescue on tankium 3.** Graphix, c2011. The evil King Bognarsh hires the Blazing Bat to stop Agent Missile Mouse, who has been sent by the Galactic Security Agency, along with his new robotic partner Agent 44, to free Tankium3, a planet that Bognarsh is forcing into slavery. **RL 4.3**

**14. 741.5 RIO: Venditti, Robert. Percy Jackson & The Olympians. Book one, The Lightning Thief: The graphic Novel.** Disney/ Hyperion Books, c2010. A graphic novel adaptation of "The Lightning Thief" in which Percy, expelled from six schools for being unable to control his temper, learns the truth from his mother that his father is the Greek god Poseidon, and is sent to Camp Half Blood, a special camp to prepare him to stop a war among the gods. **RL 4.5**

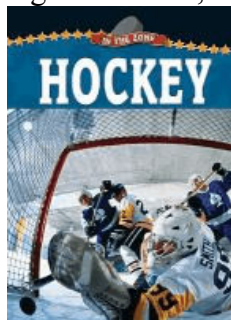


**15. 741.5 THO: Thompson, Jill. Magic Trixie 3: Magic Trixie and the dragon.** Harper Trophy, c2009. Magic Trixie, a young witch, wants a real dragon for a pet, but finds that getting one is not as easy as she thought. **RL 2.4**

**16. 741.5 WAR: Worley, Rob M. Surprise island.** A Whitman, 2009. Henry, Jessie, Violet, and Benny Alden spend a summer full of adventure and surprises while camping on their own private island. **RL 2.6**

**17. 796.815 KAR: Karapetkova, Holly. Karate.** Rourke, c2010. Photographs and simple text introduce young readers to karate, covering what karateists do and wear. **RL 1.4**

**18. 796.962 JOH: Johnstone, Robb. Hockey** Weigl Publishers, 2010. A guide to the fundamentals of hockey that covers the history, equipment, rules, positions, leagues, and superstars of the sport and includes information on diet and training for players. **RL 4.0**



**19. 811 ARC: Archer, Peggy. Name That Dog! Puppy Poems from A to Z.** Dial Books For Young Readers, c2010. A collection of illustrated poems about dogs and their names. **RL 3.1**

**20. 811 SIN: Singer, Marilyn. Mirror Mirror: A Book of Reversible Verse.** Dutton Children's Books, c2010. A collection of short poems which, when reversed, provide new perspectives on the fairy tale characters they feature. **RL 4.1**

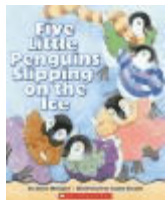


**21. 912 CAM: Campbell, Mel Walk on Maps** – Rourke Pub,

c2007. Introduces basic map concepts through a story in which a boy learns his route to school with help from his father. **RL 2.0**

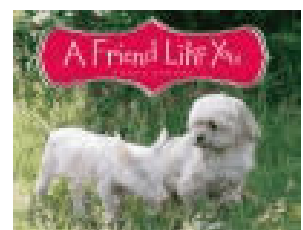
**22. 912.01 RIT: Ritchie, Scot. Follow that Map! A first look at mapping skills.** Kids Can Press, c2009. An interactive picture book that discusses and demonstrates mapping concepts as Sally and her friends search for Max and Ollie, two pets on the run from the backyard, and take a trip through the neighborhood, city, country, and world; and includes an activity. **RL 2.1**

**23. AV/CD/MET: Metzger, Steven. Five Little Penguins Slipping on Ice.** Scholastic, 2002. A counting book in which one by one the little penguins fall and hurt themselves, to the dismay of their mother and doctor. **RL 2.0**



**24. E AND: Andrews, Julie. The Very Fairy Princess.** Little Brown, c2010. Despite her scabby knees and dirty fingernails, Geraldine knows that she is a princess inside and shows it through her behavior at home and in school. **RL 3.5**

**25. E ASK: Askani, Tanja. A Friend Like You.** Scholastic Press, c2009. Simple text and photographs of unexpected animal pairs reveal different aspects of friendship. **RL 2.0**



**26. E BLU: Bluemle, Elizabeth. How Do You Wokka-Wokka?** Candlewick Press, 2009. A young boy who likes to "wokka-wokka, shimmy-shake, and shocka-shocka" gathers his neighbors together for a surprise celebration. **RL 1.7**

**27. E BRI: Brimmer, Larry Dane. Monkey Math**, Children's Press, c2007. Simple, rhyming



text counts monkeys as they swing into a kitchen, enjoy a wild visit, and swing back out. **RL 1.1**

**28. E BRO: Haskins, Lori. Flat Stanley and the Haunted House**. Harper, c 2010. Stanley Lambchop and his younger brother, Arthur, are excited about the Halloween party at school, and when they notice a bully picking on one of their friends, they come up with a plan to help. **RL 2.2**

**29. E BRO: Brown, Alan James. Love-A-Duck!** Holiday House, c2010. After falling out of the window and spending an unforgettable day outdoors, a plastic duck is returned home safely, just in time for little Jane's bath. **RL2.3**

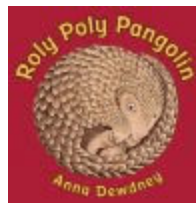

**33. E DEW: Dewdney, Anna. Roly Poly Pangolin**. Viking, c2010. Roly Poly, a pangolin, is shy and afraid of new things until he discovers that some new experiences are not bad at all. **RL 1.6**



**34. E DUN: Dunbar, Polly. Good Night, Tiptoe**. Candlewick Press, 2009. Tilly is putting all of her animal friends to bed but Tiptoe the rabbit is definitely not sleepy. **RL 2.0**

**35. E ERI: Ericsson, Jennifer A. Who Goes There?** Roaring Brook Press, c2009. Colorful illustrations and simple text about a very hungry owl looking for just the right animal for his dinner. **RL 1.3**



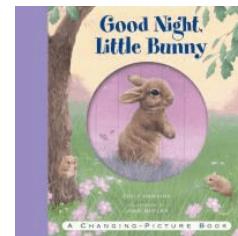

**37. E GRO: Grogan, John. Marley and the Kittens**, Harper, 2010. Marley spots two motherless kittens by the side of the road and his family gladly adopts them, but as he tries to copy the cute behavior of the little felines, the large puppy causes more and more trouble. **RL 2.6**



**38. E HAW: Hawkins, Emily. Good Night, Little Bunny** Templar Books, c2010. It is late when Little Bunny leaves his friend Dusty's house and he becomes afraid when he sees something moving in the dark forest. Includes lift-up-flaps. **RL 3.4**



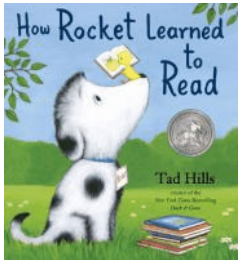

Princess Hyacinth is bored and unhappy sitting in her palace every day because, unless she is weighed down by specially-made clothes, she will float away, but her days are made brighter when kite-flying Boy stops to say hello. **RL 2.5**

**40. E HEN: Henkes, Kevin. My Garden**. Greenwillow Books, 2010. Illustrated with heavenly full-color paintings that are among the artist's very best, this picture book for young children pays tribute to a child's

imagination and independence and features an inquisitive and humorous text, making it an ideal read-aloud to treasure. **RL 3.9**

Schwartz and Wade Books, c2010. A little yellow bird teaches Rocket the dog how to read by first introducing him to the alphabet. **RL 2.9**



**42. E HUT: Hutmacher, Kimberly. Paws, Claws, Hands, and Feet.** Sylvan Dell Publishing, c2009. Illustrations and rhyming text tell of the exciting adventures a young boy has in his dreams. **RL 1.2**

**43. E INC: Nickelodeon Let's Read With Dora.** Simon Spotlight/Nickelodeon, c2010. Contains six illustrated stories for early readers that feature Dora the Explorer, including "Just Like Dora," "I Love my Mami," "Dora and the Rainbow Kite Festival," "The Puppy Twins," and "Dora's Sleepover." **RL 1.4**

**44. E KAN: Kann, Victoria. Goldilicious.** Harper, c2009. A little girl and her brother play with her imaginary gold-horned unicorn that can float on water, fly, and turn herself into a fairy princess. **RL 3.2**

hamster, with the help of a canine junkyard dealer and his mouse assistants, builds a hot rod and drives it in a race against some very large dogs. **RL 1.9**

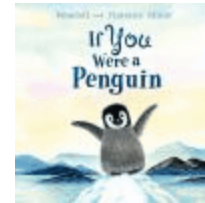

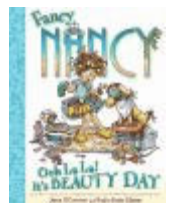
Books, 2009. Illustrations and simple rhyming text tells a story of the fun and excitement of being a penguin. **RL 2.2**
